MILESTONES

2004

St Joseph College of Communication, affiliated to MG University Kottayam was established in the month of August. Two professional degree courses, BA Animation and Graphic Design and BA Multimedia, were started at the college. Prof. John Sankaramangalam former Director FTII, Pune was appointed as the first Principal.

2005

St Joseph College of Communication was formally inaugurated by Sri. Oommen Chandy, Hon. Chief Minister of Kerala on July 2. Affiliation was granted to the first PG course at the college, MA Cinema and Television.

2006

St Joseph College of Communication hosted SJCC International Film Festival at Changanacherry. Placement cell was opened and Media Companies began to visit the campus for recruitment. International educational co-operation projects were launched.

2007

Mar Joseph Perumthottam became the Patron of the College. Scholarship for meritorious students was established, SJCC - Cheriathundam Scholarship.

2008

New office and reception was opened and blessed. Media Village "The Great Media Project" was launched by Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, former President of India.

2009

Audio Video studios were updated. Career orientation programmes were started at the College.

2010

The new hostel for boys in the campus was opened. Affiliation was granted to MA Animation, MA Multimedia and MA Graphic Design.

2011

Prof. John Sankaramangalam was relieved and reappointed as the Academic Chairman of the College. Rev. Dr Wilson Kottam was appointed as Principal.

2012

A Community FM Radio Station named 90.8 Radio Media Village was started by the college under the license of Government of India. International firms like RR Donnelly visited the campus for recruitment. Inter collegiate media fest 'Melange' was started.

2013

Rev. Dr Wilson Kottam was relieved and Prof. Chandramohan Nair was appointed as the Principal. Affiliation was granted to the UG course BA Visual Arts and the PG course MA Print and Electronic Journalism. Advanced Audio Video studio, Digital Library, 2D Lab, 3D Lab and Mini Theatre were established. 90.8 Radio Media Village has received the highest National honour from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting for the community oriented projects and programmes.

2014

The tenth anniversary of the college was celebrated with the mega event named "Media Sagra" on 13, 14 & 15 January. The presence of celebrities like Sri Rasool Pookutty, Sri Kanai Kunhiraman, Sri Priyadarsan, Sri Dharmendra Jain Narian (Director FTII Pune) added grandeur to the occasion. Radio Media Village was honoured by Govt of India for the second consecutive year with the National Award for sustainability.

2015

Affiliation was granted to the UG Courses BA Visual Communication, BA Animation & Visual Effects, BA Audiography & Digital Editing. Radio Media Village has won the National Award from the ministry of Information and Broadcasting for the third consecutive year.

2016

Prof. Chandramohan Nair was relieved and reappointed as the academic director of the College. Rev. Dr Joseph Parackal was appointed as the Principal. Two new projects are launched, MVT & MV Studios to impart students in practical learning.

2017

Renowned playback singer Mrs K.S.Chirthra inaugurated the newly built surround Atmos mixing studio on 24 October.

2018

Bangalore chapter of the Alumni Association was inaugurated on 08 April.

The First principal and the serving Academic Chairman of SJCC Prof. John Sankaramangalam expired on 30 July 2018.

2019

The first edition of Prof. John Sankaramangalam lecture series was held on 11 February 2019. Renowned film director Sri Adoor Gopalakrishnan delivered the lecture on “Cinema as an Art Form”. The Cochin Chapter of the Alumni Association was inaugurated on 4 May 2019. Affiliation was granted for B. Com Finance & Taxation.

New Foley Recording Studio for Media Village Communications was inaugurated. The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India honoured 90.8 Radio Media Village with the second prize in Sustainability Category and third prize in Promoting Local Culture category. MVTB got two Pepper Awards. The Signature film created for Changanassery Fest won the Gold while Oru Chakka Kadha bagged bronze in the webfilm category.

2020

As part of eco-friendly initiatives of the college, a hundred kilowatt solar power project was inaugurated by Mr M. M. Mani, honourable electricity minister of Kerala.

2021

Affiliation was granted for B.Com Finance & Cooperation.

2022

SJCC in its attempt to go beyond borders launched a new venture viz., MFTI (Media Village Film & Television Institute). It offers online and offline diploma courses in the field of media.

2023

To enhance the learning experience of the students a full fledged 7.1 theater named MV Cinemas was blessed and inaugurated.

To mark the beginning of the 20 anniversary of the college SJCC Film Festival was begun.

The Founder His Grace Mar Joseph Powathil passed away on March 18th. Very Rev Fr Antony Ethackad was relieved and Rev. Fr Jophy Puthuparampu was appointed as the Executive Director.

2024

The Twentieth Anniversary of SJCC marked the launch of new four-year undergraduate programmes in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. As part of a comprehensive syllabus redesign, the undergraduate programmes previously known as BA Visual Arts and BA Audiography & Digital Editing were renamed to BA Interior Architecture & Artistry and BA Sound Design & Visual Editing, respectively.

2025

The college was awarded a B++ grade accreditation from NAAC in its first cycle. On January 29, Rahul John Aju, one of the youngest AI experts in the country, inaugurated the newly built AI & XR Nexus Studio. Rev. Dr Joseph Parackal was relieved, and Rev. Dr Mathew Muriankary was appointed as Principal. On March 11, the Mayor of Cambridge, UK, Councillor Baiju Thittala, inaugurated the newly constructed Material Library. Rev. Dr James Palackal was relieved, and Very Rev. Fr Antony Ethackad was appointed as Manager.

The association cell serves as the primary contact point for alumni to the college and ensures that alumni details are updated annually.

GENERAL RULES

Guidelines and Rules of Conduct

1. All classes start as per the schedule shown in the timetable.
2. The students are expected to behave in an exemplary manner within the college campus and outside.
3. Everyday, classes begin with a prayer. As soon as the prayer bell rings, students should stand still and observe perfect silence till the prayer and announcements are over.
4. Students are expected to stand up from their seats when the teacher enters the classroom and remain so till allowed to sit down by the teacher.
5. No student shall enter or leave the classroom when the session is on, without the permission of the teacher concerned.
6. Howling or shouting is not allowed on the college campus and college buses.
7. Students should not disfigure the walls, doors, windows, desks, tables, chairs and other items with graffiti, engraving, etc.
8. All grievances are to be presented to the Principal through the class representatives.
9. Unauthorized crowding or assembly or procession inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
10. Any student who is persistently insubordinate, repeatedly or willfully mischievous, guilty of fraud or malpractice in exams shall be removed from the rolls.
11. Students are expected to dress modestly, plainly and neatly and to be punctual, disciplined, hardworking and self-confident.
12. Bikes and other vehicles are to be parked only in allotted locations.
13. Fees and other payments have to be paid within the prescribed date.
14. All students are encouraged to take part in extra-curricular and other personality development activities as scheduled by the committees.
15. Students should try to find solutions to problems by consensus.
16. As part of our civic responsibility, we should conserve electricity, water and other valuable resources.
17. Classrooms and laboratories must be kept neat and orderly.
18. Furniture, appliances and other equipment of the college must be handled carefully.

19. Students are not allowed to loiter around the campus and disturb work.
20. Students are not allowed to circulate notices, petitions or pamphlets of any kind or paste them on the notice board, walls or anywhere on the campus without the written permission of the Principal.
21. Strikes and similar demonstrations are not permitted on the campus.
22. Prior permission from the Principal is essential to take part in intercollegiate competitions, live/photographic modeling, Radio / TV programmes, etc.
23. No student shall individually or as a group produce, direct, act or give technical assistance to any film or project inside or outside the campus without the prior written permission of the Principal.
24. No student shall take up or assist in any outside project, paid or unpaid, without the written permission of the Principal.
25. Use of mobile phones, obscene cinematic dances and fashion shows on the campus are banned via G.O. - No RT/No 346/05 Higher Edn dtd 1.03. 2005.
26. Taking photographs of fellow students or members of the staff within the campus using any photographic equipment is strictly prohibited except for academic purposes approved by the college authorities.
27. SJCC requires from the students conformity to certain regulations, to benefit the entire college as well as the individual students. In accepting the offer of admission to SJCC, each student accepts the responsibility to uphold the standards of the college.
28. Students are not expected to roam around the campus after 5 pm. If any student needs to stay back on campus after 5 pm, he/she must obtain permission from the principal for the same.
29. The consumption, possession, or distribution of alcohol or drugs in any form is strictly prohibited within the college campus, including hostels and all college-related events. Any student found in violation of this rule will face stringent disciplinary action, which may include suspension from the college or hostel, and, in severe cases, expulsion from the institution. Offenders may also be subject to legal proceedings under the provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita (BNS).
30. Students are expected to operate their vehicles responsibly within the campus. Riding or driving two-wheelers and four-wheelers is strictly prohibited in and around the college playground. Additionally, indulging in races, reckless driving, or any activity that endangers the safety of others within the premises will invite disciplinary action.
31. The use, possession, or ignition of firecrackers and explosive materials within the campus is strictly prohibited.

Identity Cards

All the students will be provided with identity cards. Students are expected to wear the identity cards while on campus and during field trips. They should produce the identity card on demand for inspection by any member of the staff. Students without ID cards will not be permitted to sit in the class. If the card is lost, a duplicate card can be obtained on payment of Rs. 100/-

College Uniform

The College uniform is compulsory for all students. Students are expected to wear the uniform during field trips, examinations and other special occasions as instructed by the Principal. Students without uniforms will not be permitted to sit in the class.

Boys

- ▶ The shirt should be properly tucked inside the trousers
- ▶ They are expected to have a formal haircut at all times.
- ▶ Wearing neatly polished formal black shoes with black socks is preferred.

Girls

- ▶ They should have their hair neatly done. A neatly tied ponytail for short hair and well-plaited hair for long hair is advisable.
- ▶ Wearing neatly polished formal shoes is preferred.
- ▶ Girls and boys are not allowed to wear precious ornaments.

Laptop & Camera

All BA & MA students are expected to have laptops from the very beginning of the course itself. Students of BA Multimedia, BA Visual Communication & MA Cinema and Television are supposed to have cameras from the beginning of their course.

Use of Internet

We highly recommend judicious use of the internet by the students. Students are not supposed to spend a lot of time on the internet; Parents should restrict internet usage and make sure that students use it only for research / academic purposes.

The use of Mobile Phones on Campus is Prohibited

As per the court verdict and the instructions issued by the Kerala Government and Mahatma Gandhi University, students should not bring mobile phones to the College

Campus. Using Mobile Phones in the classroom and studios is a serious offense and will be treated with strict disciplinary actions. If anyone is found doing so, the phone will be seized and will be returned only after the parent meets the class teacher.

Political Activities

Political activities are not permitted in the College. Unauthorized meetings, propaganda, processions or fundraising are forbidden.

Notice Board

1. Important notices pertaining to the class schedule, attendance, assignment submission dates, examination dates, projects, guest lectures, seminars, etc will be displayed on the notice board from time to time.
2. Make it a habit to read, understand and follow the instructions and directions given in the notices.
3. No excuse for not having read the notice will be accepted.
4. Students do not have the right to exhibit anything on the notice board except with the permission of the Principal

Collection of Fees

1. College fees will be collected at the beginning of each semester. Late payments will be accepted with a fine within 10 days from the due date. If the fees and fine are not paid within the stipulated time of that semester, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period.
2. If the student is readmitted, he/ she will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission. A re-admission fee will be imposed on those who fail to remit the fee on time.
3. Fees once remitted will not be refunded.
4. The caution deposit will be refunded only after the completion of the course after the deductions if any, even if the student discontinues the course.

Procedure for Getting Letters or Certificates from the College Office

- ▶ If a student needs any letter from the college, the student has to contact the college reception
- ▶ Get a request form

- ▶ Fill in the request form and submit it at the college reception
- ▶ The letter will be issued within 48 hours from the college reception

LIBRARY

1. Silence must be strictly observed in and around the library.
2. Students are expected to cooperate with the library staff.
3. Do not bring bags or personal books into the library.
4. Each student is given one borrower's card from the library. One book at a time can be borrowed. When the book is returned to the library, the card will be given back. Each postgraduate student can get two books at a time.
5. Students are expected to take care not to lose the card issued to them. A student to whom a card is issued will be responsible for all the books borrowed against that card by anybody.
6. Whenever a student has to get a no dues chit or a clearance certificate from the library he/she must return to the library the card lent to him/her.
7. Students must, on receiving the books, examine them and report to the library staff any damage found therein. If they fail to do so, they will be held responsible for any damage detected afterwards.
8. A book borrowed should be returned on or before the date last marked on its date table. An overdue charge of Rs. 5/- will be levied for each day after the due date.
9. Do not make any marking or underlining in the books and periodicals belonging to the library or disfigure them in any other way.
10. If a book is damaged or lost by a student, he/she shall pay the cost of replacing the book. If one of a set of books is damaged or lost by a member, he/she must replace it with a copy of the same edition. If it is not available he/she shall replace the whole set.
11. Students are not allowed to sub-lend or exchange the cards or books issued to them.
12. The librarian can refuse to issue the same books to the same borrower repeatedly if it is necessary to prevent the monopolization of a book required by many.
13. The librarian can recall from a borrower the book at any time.

SJCC CODE OF CONDUCT REGARDING RAGGING

Ragging is prohibited in the institution and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging whether actively or passively or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC regulations 2009.

SJCC CODE OF CONDUCT REGARDING DRESS

The way a student of SJCC dresses should reflect the stature and the culture of St. Joseph College of Communication.

Students are not permitted to wear visible body adornments and display body piercing or tattoos. Wearing heavy ornaments/jewelry on campus is discouraged. Makeup should be sober and unobtrusive.

Translucent and revealing dresses are forbidden. The dress should be comfortable and sufficiently loose. On the days in which uniforms are not compulsory female students should wear tops with sleeves with a minimum of 4" length and the top should be at least 7" below the waist.

Male students must be well groomed, i.e., not wear long hair. They are also not permitted to wear earrings or studs.

Students not adhering to the above will not be allowed to attend classes & will forfeit attendance for the classes missed. For repeated violations after 3 warnings, students will be suspended from attending classes for 3 days and the parents will be informed.

ACADEMICS

Each of the programmes will have various courses which can be classified as Theory, Practical and Project.

Theory

A theory class will follow the traditional classroom pattern. Students are expected to take lecture notes and participate in the classes enthusiastically. Theory examinations have internal and external evaluation. The total marks for each paper is 100 marks, 80 marks for external and 20 marks (including 5 marks for attendance) for internal evaluation.

Practical

For practical classes students will be taken to the laboratories where they will get first hand knowledge and knowhow of the various softwares used in the industry, the techniques of film making and animation productions. The evaluation for the practical exam will be based on the submission of their Record Books and Viva Voce and/or 5 hour examination in the laboratory. The total marks for each paper is 100 marks, 80 marks for external and 20 marks (including 5 marks for attendance) for internal evaluation.

Projects

A project expects the student to apply his theoretical and practical knowledge and create a work of art based on which he will be evaluated. This project is the student's work of art that can become part of his portfolio. The evaluation for the project will be based on the submission of their Project work and Viva Voce. The total marks for each paper is 100 marks, 80 marks for external and 20 marks (including 5 marks for attendance) for internal evaluation.

Attendance and Leave of Absence

1. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period. Students should be present in the classroom before the first bell and latecomers will not be given attendance for that session. If a student is late by more than 15 minutes, parents should inform the class teacher.
2. Students should occupy their respective seats before attendance is taken. They should not leave the classroom nor should late-comers enter without the permission of the teacher in charge of the class.

3. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who repeatedly absent themselves on insufficient grounds.
4. Application for leave for a period may be made to and granted by the teacher in charge of that period.
5. A student coming to class late shall lose attendance at the session unless recommended by the teacher in charge of that class.
6. All serious cases of illness should be reported to the class teacher through the guardian or the warden. In any case of absence on account of illness, a medical certificate may be called for.
7. Students are not permitted to absent themselves without a leave application for the whole or part of a day.
8. Parents will be informed about the absence of the students daily via SMS. In case of a change of mobile numbers, parents are expected to inform the college regarding the same.
9. A student absenting himself/herself for a period exceeding three working days, whether with or without leave, should on his/her return to the college, report to the Head of the Department.
10. The minimum requirement of aggregate attendance during a semester for appearing in the end-semester university examination is 75%. A student who does not satisfy this requirement will not be permitted to take the end-semester university examinations.
11. A student with attendance between 65%-75% in a semester shall be allowed to write the end-semester university exam on strict medical grounds. The student has to submit the medical certificate and pay the condonation fees. However, this facility can be availed only once during the entire three-year programme.
12. Students with less than 65% attendance will not be allowed to appear for the end-semester university exam and will have to get readmission.
13. All students must check the SJCC portal from time to time to keep track of their attendance. Shortage of attendance will incur a year back for students without any prior warning.

Internal Examinations and Assignments

To maintain academic excellence, students will have a minimum of two assignments and two exams per semester which includes the Midterm and Model Examinations. Students are expected to submit assignments on time and score good marks for the examinations in order to score good internal marks.

It must be noted that attendance carries 5 marks which will be added to the consolidated internal marks of the student.

All details of the internal marks and attendance will be available in the SJCC portal.

University Examination Registration

Students have University Examination at the end of each semester. Registration for the university exam has to be done by each of the students.

Steps for Registration

1. Examination Registration Form has to be collected from the Class-Teacher.
2. Duly fill up the Registration Form and get the signature of the Head of the Department.
3. The Registration Form and the Exam Fees has to be given to the Accounts Department who will issue the No-dues receipt.
4. The Registration Form and the No-dues receipt have to be submitted to the Exam Cell.

University Examinations

1. Students have to be present for the examination in full uniform and well-groomed. Male students are not allowed to wear long hair.
2. Only students with ID cards and Hall tickets will be allowed inside the exam hall. Hall tickets have to be kept safely so that they can be produced for all the examinations of the semester. In case of loss of a hall ticket, the student should obtain a duplicate hall ticket from the college office paying a fine of Rs. 100 /-
3. All students must collect their hall tickets before 12.15 pm on the day of the first examination of each semester.

4. All candidates should be present at the examination hall half an hour before the scheduled time.
5. Students who are more than 30 minutes late will not be allowed to attend the examination.
6. All personal belongings including mobile phones and electronic gadgets are to be kept outside the examination hall. The use of unauthorised material is strictly prohibited.
7. Candidates are advised to take water bottles with them to the examination hall. But passing or sharing of water or any other material is not allowed inside the examination hall.
8. Cheating, plagiarism or any form of misconduct during the exam will be considered seriously and will be reported to the university.
9. Students are allowed to leave the examination hall only after two hours of the commencement of the exam.
10. Instructions given by the invigilators have to be followed without fail.

CO CURRICULAR AND EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Internship (On-the-Job Training)

The undergraduate students will have to undergo an internship programme after their fourth semester and the postgraduate students have to do it after their third semester. Students are required to make their own arrangements in any professional working environment as per the guidelines of the faculty in charge of the internships. The students should produce the internship certificate and must prepare a comprehensive report duly attested by the organization where the candidate did the internship and submit it to the faculty in charge for evaluation.

Add-on Courses

Each Department of the college will announce a set of Add-on Courses every semester. These courses help students to learn and understand areas of expertise beyond the scope of their syllabus. Interdepartmental associations and interactions will enhance student's knowledge and creativity, motivating them to expand their horizons.

1. Each Add-on course will be for 30 hours.
2. The course will be offered at a nominal fee decided by the department.
3. Attendance is mandatory.
4. Certificates will be issued on the completion of the course.

Workshops and Enrich Programmes

Workshops are organized on various industry-related topics to equip the students with updated knowledge and enhance their skills.

Seminars and Conferences

Seminars and Conferences are designed to provide a platform for intellectual exchange, professional development, and collaboration among participants from diverse fields. We believe in the transformative power of knowledge and aim to foster an environment that encourages growth, innovation, and lifelong learning. We conduct online and offline seminars from time to time.

Prof. John Sankaramangalam was the former director of Film and Television Institute of India and founding principal of St. Joseph College of Communication, his contribution to the field of media education, especially film studies is unparalleled. To pay tribute to this legendary film academician SJCC conducts a lecture series "Sankaramangalam Lectures" every year.

Counseling and Soft Skill Training

Counseling sessions are held by professional counselors every day within the campus. It is made sure that each student gets a session every semester. Counselors help identify the problems of the students and help overcome them. These sessions motivate and accompany the students in their path of realizing their dreams. We make special efforts for the holistic development of the students, so that they can prove their mettle to any one in any part of the world. The soft-skill training is given to every batch mainly in three different areas: Communication skills, Moral and Personality Development and Professional Etiquette.

Graduation Ceremony

The Graduation Ceremony is held at SJCC every year to acknowledge the efforts, hard work, and dedication of the students who have successfully completed their education. It serves as a moment of pride and honour, not only for the graduates but also for their families and teachers who have supported them throughout their journey.

All students are expected to actively participate and sincerely contribute to the programmes without affecting their academic activities. We celebrate Melange (SJCC's biennial festival), Arts Day, Youth Festival, College Day etc. We also celebrate festivals like Onam, Kerala Piravi, and Christmas.

Film Festival and SJCC productions

The SJCC Film Festival is a platform that brings together a diverse range of films, filmmakers, and film enthusiasts. It aims to inspire, educate, and entertain while contributing to the growth of the film industry. Participants include students, alumni and prominent filmmakers. Animation films are also included.

The final year post graduate students come out with a Demo Film every year which provides an opportunity for them to showcase their remarkable talent and potential. The latest film "Baloons" won much international acclaim.

Incubation Centre

An Incubation Centre is conceived by the college as a space for students to come together and form new ideas. It is an area for new start ups, assistance will be given to students who want to make short films, works for government agencies can also be done under the leadership of the college.

The college has the MV Cinemas, a state of the art theatre for students to watch films and have discussions, two Green Matte Studios which are used by students to enhance their VFX shots and create news production and other purposes where the subject has to be set in a new and enhanced background. The college has a Stop Motion Studio. Animation students use the Stop Motion Studio to physically manipulate objects with small increments, and photographs are taken in a series of frames to be played back. It is done mainly by Animation and Graphic Design and Animation Visual Effects students. A Television Studio along with a teleprompter is available in the college in which video productions take place. These rooms are connected via talkback; or an intercom. We also have state of the art Audio studios with folly and Dolby atmos. Apart from the above we also have 90.8 Radio Media Village, a flagship concern of SJCC.

Media Village Television, MVT, an online TV Channel powered by YouTube is run by the college to provide on the job training to the students in content production and webcasting. It telecasts a variety of infotainment and social awareness programmes made by the students themselves under the guidance of experienced professionals. MV Studios is a wing of SJCC that produces ad films, brand promotion events, films of all genres.

Media Village Film and Television Institute provides online and offline training in a variety of media related areas from computer fundamentals to high-end tools of design and animation like Maya, AutoCAD and 3ds Max. It also provides diplomas in Photography, Design, Animation, Vfx, Film Making, Editing etc.


