1. Statement of Policy

The Minority Protection Policy of St. Joseph College of Communication, Changanassery, underscores the institution's commitment to empowering minority communities within the college. As a minority educational institution, SJCC prioritizes the needs and development of minority students, recognizing that "every student has a right to education." This policy is dedicated to providing comprehensive support to the educational and cultural needs of minority students, ensuring an inclusive environment that respects all castes, creeds, and nationalities. The Minority Cell plays a crucial role in facilitating the academic development of minority students, offering targeted services and resources to help them excel in their studies and fully participate in the college community.

2. Definition

A minority in the territory of a State means it is not the majority. Objectively, that means that an ethnic, religious or linguistic group makes up less than half the population of a country. The six communities notified as minority communities under Section 2(c) of the National Commission for Minorities (NCM) Act, 1992 are Christians, Sikhs, Muslims, Buddhists, Parsis and Jains. Articles 29 and 30 of the Constitution provide for the protection of the interest of minorities which includes linguistic minorities also.

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3. Objectives

- To provide equal opportunity for the education of minorities.
- To create awareness among the minority students regarding various scholarship programs of State Government and UGC.
- To facilitate financial support to students from minority communities from governmental agencies and other sources.
- To take follow-up measures for achieving the objectives and targets laid down for the purpose by the Government of India and the UGC.
- To ensure provisions for an environment where all such students feel safe and secure.
- To encourage participation in career orientation programs which would empower and equip them with the necessary skills to choose career options.
- To provide prompt counselling for any emotional emergencies arising on account of any event at the campus.
- To ensure protection and reservation as provided in the constitution of India.
