1. Statement of Policy

- Partner with local organizations, NGOs, and government bodies to undertake collaborative projects that address community needs and challenges.
- Initiate and support environmental conservation projects, encouraging sustainable practices within the college and the broader community.

- Students involved in community outreach activities must maintain appropriate behaviour on campus, in the community, and in online interactions.
